The City of Prince George Park and Trail System is developed for people like you, to serve the recreation needs of residents as well as visitors to Prince George. With over 140 parks in the system, your recreation opportunities are virtually unlimited for year-round enjoyment.

The Parks & Recreation Division's purpose is to provide for the safe operation and maintenance of City parks, boulevards, trails and open spaces. Achieving this purpose assists the City in fulfilling our destiny as B.C.'s Northern Capital.

PARK RESERVATIONS

Park sites are perfect for special events, such as group picnics, community events, weddings, and photos. A park use permit reserves your date, time, and place, so there is no conflict with other groups. Park use permits are available at the Leisure Services Department.

DESTINATION PARKS

FORESTS FOR THE WORLD

Forests For The World is minutes from downtown Prince George and is a favourite hiking, biking and picnic destination. Over 15 km of trails take you through a variety of habitats. Visit Shane Lake, view the City from the upper lookout, have a picnic, or take a self-guided nature walk. Brochures are available at City Hall.

CRANBROOK HILL GREENWAY

Cranbrook Hill Greenway has over 25 km of multi-use trails that are open year round for activities such as biking, hiking and skiing. The Greenway can be accessed from several different locations. Brochures and maps are available at City Hall or local outdoor recreation outlets.

COTTONWOOD ISLAND PARK

Cottonwood Island Nature Park is situated along the Nechako River and is a great place to spend the day. Take a picnic lunch and enjoy the many trails throughout the park. Be sure to visit the P.G. Railway and Forestry Museum while you are there. Brochures for the park are available at City Hall.

MOORE'S MEADOW PARK

Moore's Meadow Park provides many recreation opportunities year round. Take a walk through this natural park in autumn and view the splendid fall colours.

PEOPLE, PETS & PARKS

Parks are for everyone. As part of the Parks and Open Spaces bylaw the City of Prince George is proposing "Off Leash/Under Control Areas", "Leash Areas", and "No Pet Areas".



OFF LEASH/UNDER CONTROL AREAS

Areas have been identified throughout the City. The areas where pets may be off leash, pets must remain under the control of the owner. Maps are available at the Leisure Services Department.



LEASH AREAS

Leash areas will be identified by signage at specific parks. The leash should not exceed 2 meters in length.



NO PET AREAS

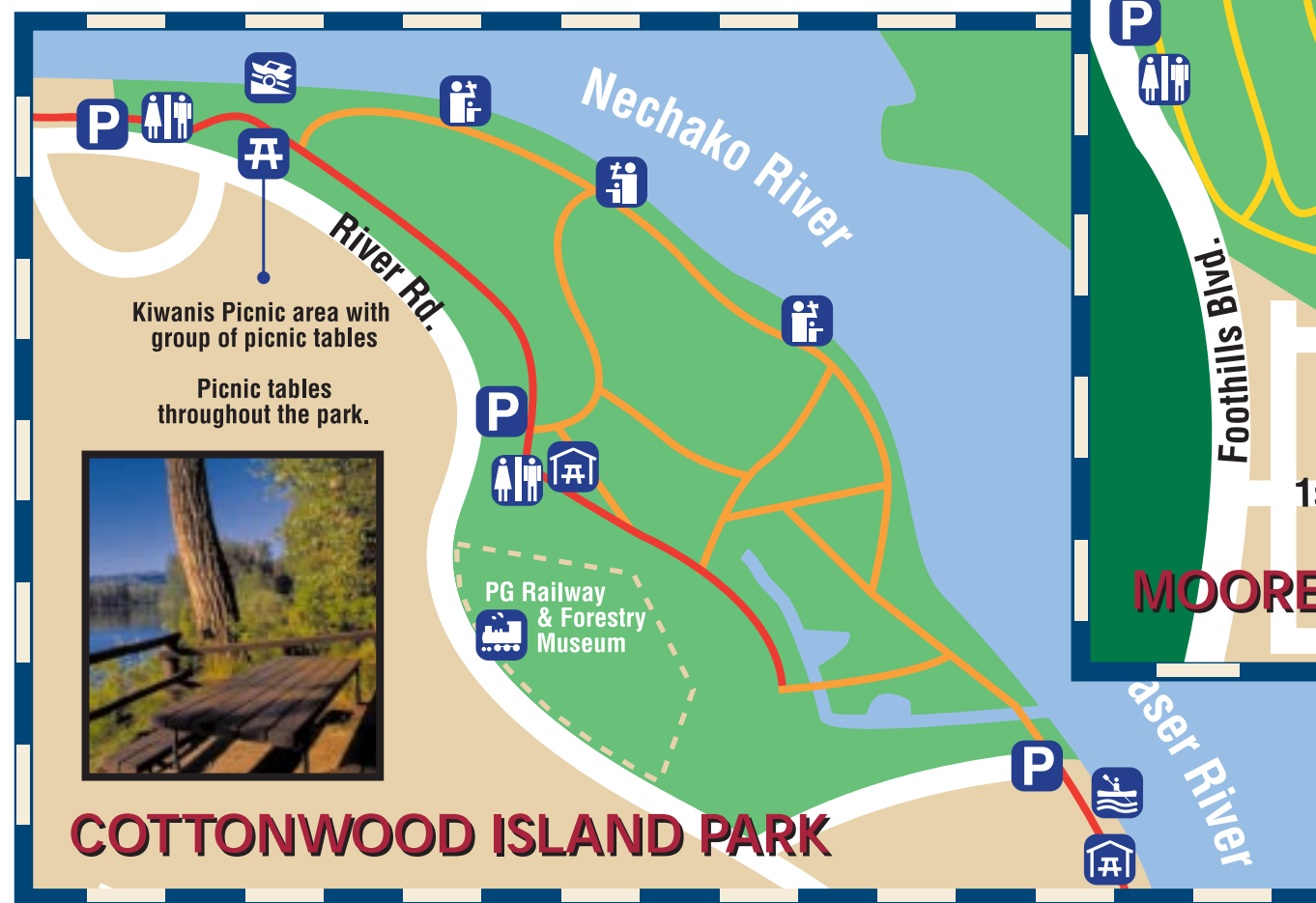
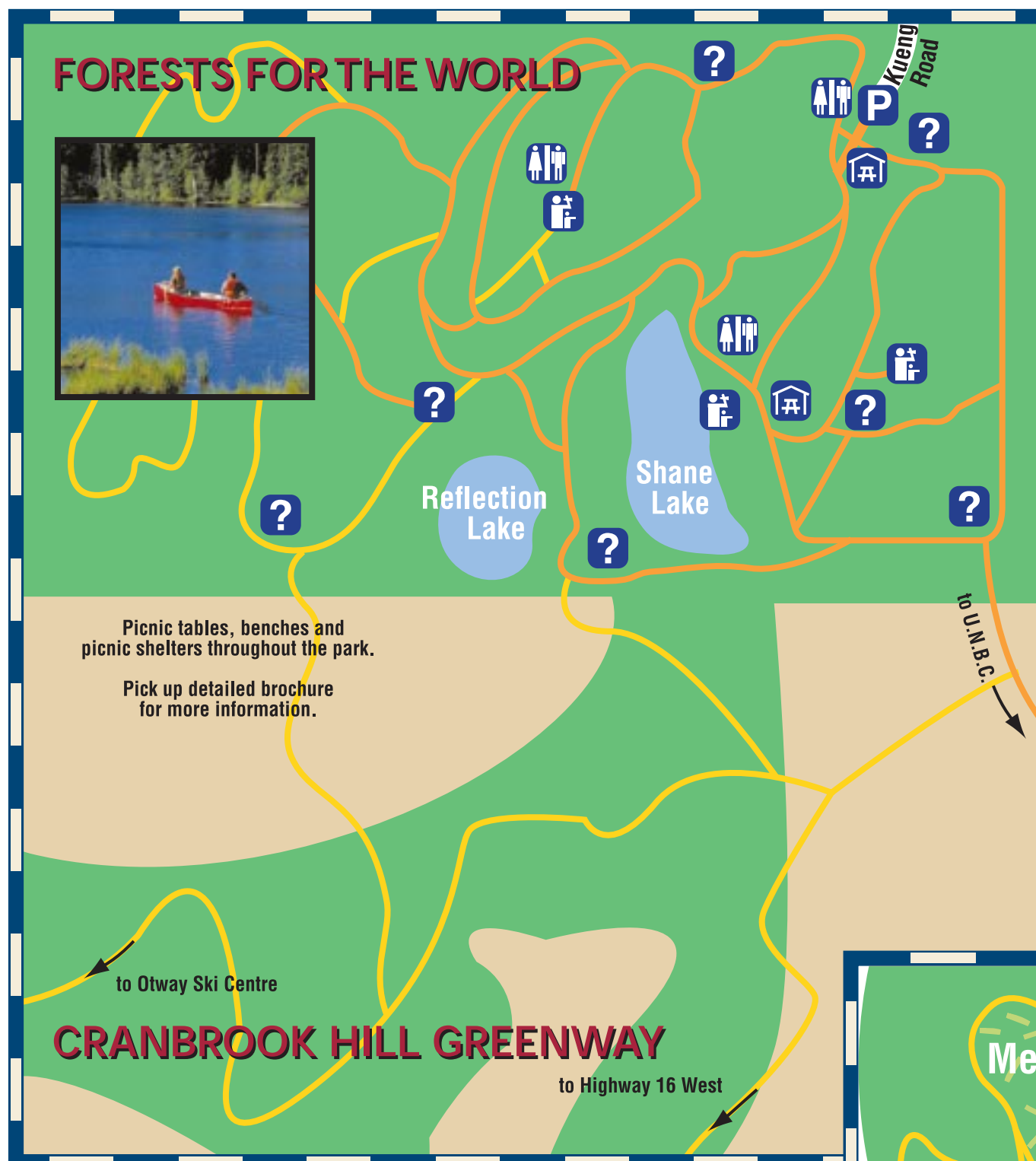
No Pet Areas include playgrounds, sport fields, beaches, and water park areas.
